## Course: *E296 Application of Hazards United States (HAZUS) for Risk Assessment*

**Date:** January 16-19, 2012

### Course Description:

This course provides participants with an understanding of how they can use the HAZUS risk assessment software methodology and tools to assist them in their efforts to conduct the community risk assessments that are necessary to be compliant with ongoing requirements of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000.

### Course Goal:

1. This course is designed to assist with setting conditions which must be met for communities to be eligible to receive certain disaster relief funding.
2. This course includes hands-on computer exercises using the Hazus software and other tools such as the Hazus Risk Assessment Tool and flood Wizard to perform risk assessment-related tasks.
3. This course focuses on the process of applying the wealth of information that the Hazus software includes, and that can produce, to the risk assessment process.

### Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length. Travel days are Sunday and Friday.

### Continuing Education Units (CEUs):

The Emergency Management Institute awards 3.2 CEUs for completion of this course.

### Target Audience:

The course is intended for the following: State and local emergency managers; State and local Geographic Information System (GIS) specialists responsible for risk assessment activities; regional personnel responsible for mitigation and response activities; other Federal agencies with a need to conduct risk assessment; and State and local planners. The need to attend this training must be documented in **block 16** of the application. Strong GIS experience and completion of the E313 Basic HAZUS-MH course are strongly recommended. Applicants will be enrolled on a first-come, first-served basis.

# TRAINING OPPORTUNITY

Upon acceptance into the course, NETC Admissions will mail out an Acceptance Letter/Welcome Package outlining travel information, NETC Shuttle services, lodging and other logistics.
