E450 Executive Emergency Management Symposium

The E450 course is a two-day symposium for emergency management professionals at the executive level only. It is the first of several classes being developed by the Emergency Management Institute as part of a competitive curriculum, the Executive Emergency Management Officer Program.

The course will consist of presentations and discussions by course participants on the latest developments and issues impacting emergency management. Course topic areas will be determined by the Course Manager in coordination with the Focus Group for the course and may include items such as: Coordination within the emergency management field among disciplines, new requirements of emergency management and their impact on the field, global warming and its impact on emergency management, social economic migration trends and their impact on emergency management, etc.

Selection Criteria: Full time executive level Federal, State, Tribal or local Emergency Managers with experience in major catastrophic events or those holding major policy making position related to emergency management. Also included are those in related academic fields, Executive Directors of Emergency Management-related professional organizations such as the National Emergency Management Association, the International Association of Emergency Managers, the Association of State Floodplain Managers, the American Public Works Association, the International Association of Fire Chiefs, etc. as well as leadership positions in State or other associations.

Prerequisites: Associates degree required, Bachelor's or higher degree preferred.

Course Length: 2 days
