IS-273 How to Read a Flood Insurance Rate Map

Course Dates:

Course Length:

The overall time to complete the course will vary for each individual. IS-273 takes approximately 3 hours.

Course Description:

The purpose of this course is to provide the participants with the knowledge and skills required to use Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) to determine the potential flood risks for a specific property to determine if a property should be protected against flood loss. Participants will learn about various types of flood maps, explain the elements on the map, and demonstrate how to use a flood map to obtain information for a specific property location.

Upon completing this course, the participant will be able to describe how to:

- 1. Recognize various flood map formats
- 2. Recognize FIRM elements and symbols
- 3. Read and use FIRMs to identify flood hazards
