Course Description:

Space weather is a natural hazard that can significantly affect critical infrastructure essential to the economy, social wellbeing, and national security, such as electrical power, water supply, healthcare, and transportation. This course provides participants with an overview of space weather and information on how to better prepare for, protect against, and mitigate the effects of space weather events.

Goal:

The goal of the course will be to strengthen understanding of space weather events; the potential impacts from those events; and the roles of the Federal Government, as well as the local and jurisdictional Emergency Manager in preparing for and mitigating such impacts.
