Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length, 8 hours each day.

Location:

- **E0131** is held at the Emergency Management Institute (EMI), National Emergency Training Center (NETC) in Emmitsburg, Maryland.
- **K0131** is conducted virtually, and you will be provided the log-in link prior to the class date.

Course Description:

This course will expand on the concepts of exercise evaluation and improvement planning that were introduced in the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) course. Students will learn how to establish an exercise evaluation program, gather evaluation data effectively during exercises, and implement and track improvements as part of a Continuous Improvement Program within their organization.

Target Audience:

Ideal candidates will have 1–3 years' experience designing and conducting emergency management exercises consistent with the HSEEP Doctrine.

How to Apply:

Apply for this course at <u>National Emergency Training Center Online Admissions Application</u> (https://training.fema.gov/netc online admissions).

Applications must include completion certificates of IS-120: *An Introduction to Exercises;* IS-0130a: *How to be an Exercise Evaluator;* and E/K/L0146: *HSEEP,* as attachments. Applications should be routed to your State Training Officer (STO) for approval. Federal applicants, please route to your FEMA Regional Training Manager. Upon acceptance into the course, NETC Admissions will email the student.

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Travel and Housing Information:
