Course Description:

This National Disaster & Emergency Management University (NDEMU) course provides state, local, tribal, and territorial staffs with an overview of FEMA's Public Assistance (PA) Program, process, and policies. Course topics include introduction to program laws, regulations, policies, the PA process, grants management, eligibility, hazard mitigation in the PA Program, compliance with other Federal laws and regulations, and project formulation.
