Internship, Scholarship, Research and Training Opportunities

<u>Frederick Community College (FCC) and Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) Sign New</u> <u>Agreement with Transfer Pathways and Tuition Discount</u> (https://www.frederick.edu/news/fcc-and-southernnew-hampshire-university-sign-new.aspx). FCC and Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) have signed an agreement that will ease the transfer process and provide a tuition discount for FCC graduates transferring to SNHU. The new agreement allows FCC graduates to transfer up to 90 credits toward an online bachelor's degree program at SNHU. In addition, FCC alumni, employees, and family members (spouses, domestic partners, children, siblings, and parents) will receive a 10% tuition discount as well as a waiver of the application fee.

Natural Hazards Engineering Research Infrastructure (NHERI) Research Experiences for

Undergraduates (REU). The NHERI REU Summer Program provides research opportunities at the 11 NHERI multi-hazard engineering and interdisciplinary research sites during a 10-week summer research program. The NHERI REU program is dedicated to helping undergraduate college students experience multi-hazard engineering as well as reconnaissance, cyber infrastructure, data management, simulation, and social science research. Hands-on, research-based projects introduce participants to a network of engineers, scientists, and students who work toward mitigating the effects of natural hazards and understanding the impact of natural hazards on society.
