# Creation of new Special Interest Group (SIG): Wildland Urban Interface Governance

The focus of the Wildland Urban Interface Governance SIG is the intersection of science and policy in the reduction of risk in the wildland urban interface (WUI). The science behind fire at the WUI is extensive and sufficient in many respects—but it is also spread across many distinct domains and, as such, greater integration can help reduce risk and promote community resilience more effectively. An understanding of the multidimensional and interactive nature of WUI fire risk requires an appreciation of the complexity to develop effective governance: sound public policies across the federal system, robust cross-sector cooperation and collaboration, increased public awareness and efficacious management practices. With over 43,000,000 homes in the WUI across the United States, the scale of this escalating problem requires comprehensive public policy improvements that can be readily adapted and implemented across a diverse and wide range of communities. As the WUI challenge is not limited to the United States, the SIG will invite engagement from colleagues in other national systems. The SIG will also seek to serve as a venue for practitioner and academic exchange on WUI topics, including efforts to improve WUI awareness in higher education programs.

#### Working Objectives of the WUI Governance SIG:

- Develop a comprehensive WUI Fire Risk framework and sense-making of complex risks
- Review the relevant disaster science and assessment of areas of improved governance
- Create and promote easy access to WUI-related disaster science and public policy and management innovation through a web-based dashboard
- Promote effective policy development and implementation tools
- Promote a venue for exchange between practitioners and the higher education community

FEMA Accepts New Applications for COVID-19 Assistance to Firefighters Grant. FEMA is providing an additional chance for volunteer and combination fire departments to apply for funding under this year's Assistance to Firefighters COVID-19 Supplemental grant. Volunteer and combination fire departments are eligible to apply in this round even if they had a successful application in the first round earlier this year. However, applications must support new capabilities. Departments that applied in the first round but were unsuccessful must reapply to be considered for funding in this round. Applications from the first round will not automatically carry forward to this round for consideration. FEMA will accept applications until 5 p.m. ET on Nov. 13.
