Weekly Methodological Dimensions of COVID-19 Survey Research Series, starting Wednesday, September 9, 2020. The Collaboration for Emergency Management, Policy, and Preparedness Research (CEMPPR) Lab at York University in Toronto, Canada launched a public, weekly series of discussions on

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the methodological dimensions of COVID-19 survey research. Each meeting features an expert guest discussing innovations in the field, the chance to share the projects/results you're working on, and a rapid-fire, focused discussion on a shared methodological challenge. The first session features two members of the Statistics Canada team speaking about their experimental methods for national data collection on COVID-19.
