## **Call for Proposals**

We invite members of the HiEd community to submit academic research inquiry proposals to <u>FEMA-HiEd@fema.dhs.gov</u>, with a deadline of **June 30, 2021**. <u>The template for submissions is located on the HiEd website</u>: https://training.fema.gov/hiedu/latest/2020.aspx.

In 2018, the HiEd Program convened an interdisciplinary focus group and <u>published a 3 to 5-year research</u> agenda focusing on hazards, disasters, and emergency management

508%20(march%202018).pdf). The goal was to bridge the gap between academic research and practice and seek answers to complex real-world problems. Proposals must align with the research agenda in order to be considered. Proposals must address a community need, be of value and interest to FEMA, and align with the Next Generation Core Competencies

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Proposals related to regional academic engagements and Special Interest Groups (SIGs) are encouraged. Information on current SIGs is available here: https://training.fema.gov/hiedu/specialinterest/sig.aspx. Proposals will be reviewed by the HiEd team and other FEMA offices as appropriate, including the relevant FEMA region. Based on the review, some proposals will be selected for collaborative development of final language for award. The HiEd Program will award a limited number of micro-purchases for academic research inquiries at \$3,500-\$5,000 each for a period of performance of up to 12 months. In rare instances, HiEd may award up to \$10,000 for research of exceptional merit. Awards will be made by Sept. 30, 2021.

Upon award, researchers will be expected to participate in periodic status meetings with the HiEd team, community calls and provide written summaries upon request for the HiEd Program newsletter. Following the completion of the research activity, a report will be submitted to the HiEd Program. The report will be reviewed for content, format and section 508 compliance, approved and disseminated to relevant stakeholders via the HiEd Program newsletter and website. Research inquiries will be considered as potential topics for the annual symposium and other HiEd events.
