\$1.16 billion in Hazard Mitigation Assistance Available. The Flood Mitigation Assistance (https://www.fema.gov/grants/mitigation/floods) and the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (https://www.fema.gov/grants/mitigation/building-resilient-infrastructure-communities) provides funds to states, local communities, tribes and territories for eligible mitigation activities to strengthen our nation's ability to build a culture of preparedness.
