Emergency Management SoTL Handbook *Caroline Hackerott*



Growing out of the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) Focus Group in 2018, the co-chairs (Claire Knox and Carol Hackerott) along with Shirley Feldmann-Jensen presented a pre-Symposium workshop in two parts. The first part covered the basics of research as related to SoTL. The second part was devoted to individual coaching to participants as they developed and/or refined SoTL research proposals. Because the majority of the HiEd community active in FEMA-sponsored events is not employed at research institutions, many community members feel under-prepared to contribute to this essential aspect of our body of knowledge.

In an effort to present basic SoTL research methodology in written form, Carol Hackerott is developing a short and simple handbook intended for non-research faculty. Handbook topics include the definition of SoTL, the history of Emergency Management SoTL and its relationship to other disciplines' work, developing a research question and study design, research ethics, data collection, data analysis, and writing and disseminating findings. Any community member who wishes to assist in the review and/or editing of the handbook should also reach out to her. The handbook will be made available on the HiEd website and introduced to the community via a webinar or presentation upon completion.
