

Studies are organized by location, type, and hazard, so users can quickly find valuable risk information for their emergency management projects.

The Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant (https://www.fema.gov/grants/mitigation/floods) and the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (https://www.fema.gov/grants/mitigation/building-resilient-infrastructure-communities) provides funds to states, local communities, tribes and territories for eligible mitigation activities to strengthen our nation's ability to build a culture of preparedness. Eligible applicants must apply for funding using FEMA Grants Outcomes, the agency's grants management system. **Submit applications in FEMA Grants Outcome Portal no later than 3 p.m. ET on January 28, 2022.** Applications received by FEMA after this deadline will not be considered for funding.
