Course: *E0103 Planning: Emergency Operations* Course Offerings for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) National Emergency Management Basic Academy

Dates and Location:

The E0103 offerings are as follows:

June 18-19, 2015 Emmitsburg, MD

August 13-14, 2015 Emmitsburg, MD

The E0102 offerings are as follows:

June 15-17, 2015 Emmitsburg, MD

August 10-12, 2015 Emmitsburg, MD

NOTE: The E0103 Planning: Emergency Operations course is delivered at the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) during the same week with E0102 Science of Disaster. Students are required to apply for the two courses for the same week. Both courses can be listed on the same application.

Course Description:

This course in the National Emergency Management Basic Academy is designed to give basic concepts and planning steps to those new to the field of emergency management so that they may apply planning discipline and skills to challenges in their jobs.

The course content includes emergency management planning doctrine and steps to take to accomplish writing plans and using them to deal with events, concluding with an exercise suitable for all jurisdictions.

The content derives from Comprehensive Preparedness Guide 101, Developing and Maintaining State,

Territorial, Tribal and Local Government Emergency Plans and its six step planning process. It includes whole community philosophy. Doctrine from Comprehensive Preparedness Guide 201, Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Analysis is also included in the course.

Course Goal:

The goals of this course are to promote effective emergency management planning practices and to enhance planning skills through application exercises.

Course Length:

Two days (five days when taken with E0102).

Prerequisite: E0101 Foundations of Emergency Management

Continuing Education Units (CEU's):

EMI awards 1.6 CEUs for completion of this course.

Target Audience:

This course is intended for newly appointed emergency managers from state, local, territorial, tribal, and Federal emergency management agencies, and prospective professionals transferring from another discipline to emergency management. Veteran emergency managers willing to mentor are also welcome to apply.

The FEMA Form 119-25 must be received six weeks prior to the course start date.

Application Review:

In order to be evaluated for admission into this course, block #16 on the application form (FEMA Form 119-25-1) must be completed. Please indicate how you meet the requirements based upon your position and experience. Acceptance into any of the Basic Academy courses will be on a first come, first served basis.

Student Stipends:

Notice to Applicants for EMI courses:

Individuals applying for EMI classes will be required to register using the FEMA Student Identification (SID) number. This number will be used in place of the Social Security Number (SSN) on your application form. **The SSN is no longer required.**

How do I obtain my FEMA SID number?
