Dates: May 24–26, 2016

Travel Dates:

Travel days are May 23 and May 27, 2016.

Travel and Per Diem for Federal staff is the responsibility of the participant's office, directorate, or region.

Course Length:

This symposium is 3 days in length. Travel days are Monday and Friday.

Course Description:

This Symposium provides a review of training and exercise programs within the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that are applicable to our state, local, tribal, and territorial (SLTT) partners. The symposium also provides a forum for sharing best practices and case studies in training and exercises from the SLTT level.

Course Objectives:

1. Based on the information acquired during the National Preparedness Symposium, participants will identify at least one element to implement, modify, or validate in their training and exercise program.
2. Identify tools, resources, processes, and methods for determining capability gaps in a participant's jurisdiction that can be filled through training and validated by exercises.
 - a. Identify methods to determine if training is the appropriate element to close a capability gap.

3. Identify the tools for **planning, executing, and evaluating** training and exercise programs to close identified gaps.
