The Master Exercise Practitioner Program (MEPP) is a series of two resident courses (E0132, E0133) focusing on advanced program management, exercise design and evaluation practices in each phase of the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP). MEPP candidates work in a collaborative environment to discuss best practices and exercise challenges. Candidates will be required to complete an operations-based capstone exercise within one year of completing the E0133 course. This exercise should be on their agency/jurisdictions overall Training and Exercise Plan.

Course Goal:

Candidates will discuss best practices and

lessons learned from their organizations and experiences in all areas of exercise program management, design, conduct and evaluation. The Capstone Exercise will demonstrate proficiency.

- 1. Complete all 10 pre-requisites.
- 2. Complete FEMA Form 119-25-1, General Admissions Application.
- 3. Submit a narrative document that outlines your current job description, role in agency/justifications exercise program, chronological listing of all exercises you have participated in as a player or planner. This experience should reflect 3-5 years.
- 4. Submit a letter of support from your direct supervisor outlining your role in your agency's exercise program and an acknowledgement of the commitment of the course, specifically the capstone exercise requirement.
