Course Dates:

January 9–12, 2023

Travel Dates:

January 8, 2023, and January 13, 2023

Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length.

Location:

This course will be delivered at the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

Course Description:

This course will better prepare participants to fully plan for, respond to, and recover from major debris-generating events.

Target Audience:

This course is designed for State, tribal, territorial, and local officials who are responsible for planning, managing, and/or implementing debris removal and disposal activities for all types of disasters.

Travel and Housing Information:

Upon acceptance into the course, NETC Admissions will mail out an Acceptance Letter and [NETC Welcome Package](https://www.usfa.fema.gov/downloads/pdf/netc_welcome_package.pdf) (https://www.usfa.fema.gov/downloads/pdf/netc_welcome_package.pdf) outlining travel information, NETC shuttle services, lodging, and other logistics.

Lodging is provided for course participants on the NETC campus. Participants staying overnight on campus are required to purchase a meal ticket for the duration of the training activity. Notify the NETC Transportation Office at least 2 weeks prior to the course date to reserve a shuttle seat.

Notice to Applicants for EMI Courses:

Individuals applying for EMI classes will be required to register using the FEMA Student Identification (SID) number.

How do I obtain my FEMA SID number?

Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account. You will receive an email with your SID number. You should save this number in a secure location.
