Course Length:

4 full days: 8 a.m.–5 p.m. (Monday–Thursday)

Symposium Description:

The Symposium will inform the participants on ways to prepare communities for cyber incidents and make them more resilient in the aftermath. The agenda will include presentations from subject matter experts on how to prepare your community or enterprise for cyber threats and FEMA-certified courses from members of the National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium, including Preparing for Cyber Attacks and Incidents and Community Cybersecurity Preparedness

Simulation. These courses are designed to prepare a community to respond to and defend against cyber-attacks through planning, information sharing and other methods, and to mitigate any consequences of such attacks.

Target Audience:

Seating is limited for this Symposium. The target audience for the week includes emergency managers and first line responders, as well as IT and cybersecurity professionals. Applicants from state, local, tribal, and territorial government staff, as well as those from the Federal government and the private sector, are welcome to apply.

Prerequisites:
