This program will feature the following:

CDC Tiered Labs: CoMNET reporter John Eastman takes us to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, Georgia and talks with officials from the Tiered Labs Program. CoMNET explores the labs’ protocols and processes, giving viewers an understanding of the level A through D Labs.

Containment and Quarantine: In a WMD incident, several significant questions face the response community regarding containment and quarantine: Who will enforce them? Who has the authority to initiate and impose them? When should they be initiated? What gaps exist now in current policies? CoMNET brings you insights to these and other important questions.

Civil Support Team Training at Ft. Leonard Wood: CoMNET reporter Arch Deal went to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri to observe Civil Support Team Lanes Training. Arch explores the teams' collective training and highlights the sample collection process.

Joint Agency Exercise in Pinellas County, Florida: First responders in Pinellas County, Florida participated in a four-day exercise involving a simulated bio-terrorist attack. CoMNET takes viewers into the action as a local emergency operations center copes with a situation in which thousands of patients overwhelm ambulances and emergency rooms. Law enforcement joins the exercise in a tactical apprehension of the suspected terrorists. The story concludes with valuable lessons learned from the exercise.
