The first day of the Train-the-Trainer is devoted to course delivery strategy, logistics, demonstrations, and adult learning methods.

Prerequisites

Candidates must have at least five years' experience in emergency management and three years' experience facilitating adult learning. Completion of the E/L0101 Foundations of Emergency Management course is highly recommended. Below are additional requirements:

- IS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100
- IS-230 Fundamentals of Emergency Management
- IS-700 National Incident Management System (NIMS), An Introduction
- IS-800 National Response Framework, An Introduction

Resume and transcripts of above courses.

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

National Emergency Management Basic Academy Train the Trainer

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recognizes the need to develop an established set of emergency management competencies and to establish a career development program through a professional development system that includes the Basic Academy. The Emergency Management Institute (EMI) offers the opportunity to candidates who are experienced in emergency management and adult learning to consider becoming qualified as an instructor for the Basic Academy courses.

The Basic Academy Train-the-Trainer consists of two days of discussions about course objectives, facilitating the classroom and classroom time management. The last three days consist of student teach backs that demonstrate students' knowledge of the Basic Academy courses subject matter.

All topic areas in the Basic Academy courses are covered in the Train-the-Trainer to support a training experience that combines knowledge of all fundamental systems, concepts, and practices of cutting-edge emergency management. The Academy provides shared classrooms of adult learners and skillful instructors resulting in a solid foundation upon which to build further studies and sound decisions.

Target Audience

This course is intended for individuals experienced in emergency management and instructing emergency management to adults.

Selection Criteria

This course is intended for those emergency managers and trainers from Federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial emergency management agencies who have extensive background in emergency management and experience in facilitating adult learning.

- Minimum five (5) years' experience in emergency management (recommended to be current practitioners).
- Proven and proficient capability to deliver and facilitate training (EMI resume/recommendation review).
- Demonstrated knowledge of the fundamental systems, concepts, and current practices in emergency management.
- Resume detailing responsibilities, authority and length of time in profession.
- Effectiveness teaching emergency management to adults.

Upon completion of this course, students will possess the skills necessary to facilitate an offering of the Basic Academy courses.
