### Higher Education Updates

#### Message from Wendy Walsh, Higher Education Program Manager

This week has been very inspiring as we convened a focus group to address emergency management curricula needs! We had some challenges with transportation, but with the grace of technology we were able to have very good participation. I am always uplifted when I have the opportunity to work directly with our emergency management higher education community. We will post a full report of our conversation on the higher education website and plan to follow up with an opportunity for the broader community to share feedback and perspectives.

Some of the highlights of our conversation have included hearty discussion around sharing case studies, developing and distributing research briefs, organizing and building course support materials, addressing professional development, promoting cultural understanding and perspectives, and ensuring we have an eye to the future of the emergency management discipline. We also have been discussing the myriad of partners and how to consider their perspectives and needs.

Some immediate developments that came from this engagement are the development of two new Special Interest Groups (SIGs): The Racial, Ethnicity and Income Considerations in Emergency Management SIG and the Virtual Resources and Simulation Tools for the Emergency Management Classroom SIG. Download the free FEMA [app](#) to help keep your family stay safe through emergencies, even from across the country. With weather alerts available from anywhere in the U.S., know when severe weather may impact far-away students and family. Emergency safety tips, available even if internet and phone lines are down, can quickly teach FEMA app users what to do before, during and after all kinds of emergencies. Also set up a family communication plans, customizable checklist of emergency supplies, and maps of open shelters and disaster recovery centers all within the app. The app is available free on the Apple App Store and on Google Play. Every year, September is recognized as [National Preparedness Month](#) which serves as a reminder that we all must take action to prepare, now and throughout the year, for the types of emergencies that could affect us where we live, work, and also where we visit.

DHS Continuing Training Grants Submission time is open through September 22, 2016- Higher Education Institutions are eligible for this grant and there is not match required. The priority focus areas for this year are cybersecurity, hazardous materials, economic recovery and rural preparedness. First Responder Support Tool (FiRST) app provides a map-based visualization of a hazmat or improvised explosive device scenario. There is a cost associated, and you must be registered to receive permission to download a super-fast version of CAMEO/MARPLOT/ALOHA on your smart phone/tablet.

AskRail app works in conjunction with the FiRST App. This app is free and again requires permission. Since every rail car has a unique identifier (i.e. CBAX 2103) that when typed into the app, will let you know the chemical, loaded, unloaded, or residue - the contact information of the railroad, and the Emergency Response Guide for that chemical, as well as open this hazmat event in the FiRST App.
