Results of the [first round](#) of a Policy Delphi Study that [Evidence Aid](#) carried out in association with Georgetown University and the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. The purpose of the study is *to engage a wide range of key stakeholders in dialogue regarding disaster responses, including for example, evidence for best practices in disaster response, approaches to improving investments in disaster response with Cochrane-style (systematic review) analysis of evidence, identification of gaps in the evidence base for disaster response; and factors that impact on effective disaster response.* The study is now closed – Round 2 closed in November, and Round 3 took place during the Evidence Aid [conference](#) in Washington D.C. in mid-November. Evidence Aid will release the results of Rounds 2 and 3 in due course.

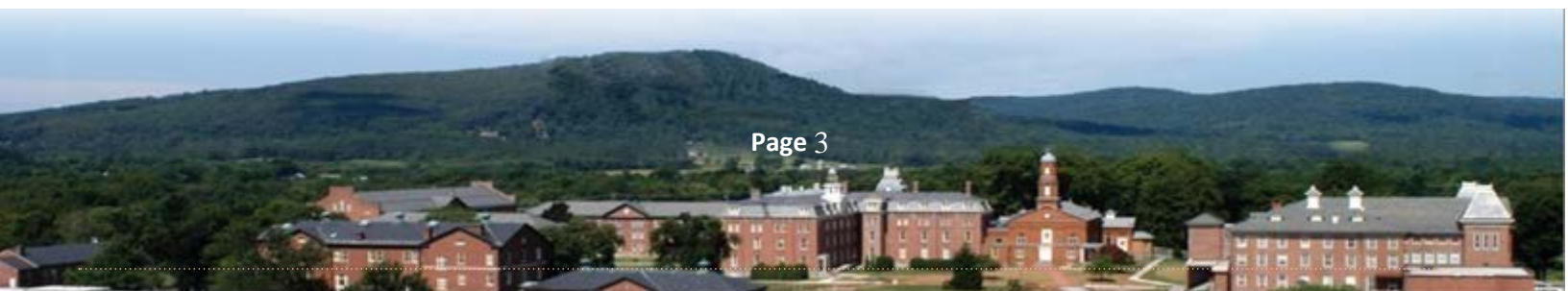
