Recent events in Orlando and Dallas have created discussions around all-hazards preparedness which include natural and man-made disasters. Over the past few weeks many of us have asked how we are looking at active shooter events. How do we discuss these events in our classrooms and help students contemplate ideas and actions toward prevention, mitigation, response and recovery?

We would like to dedicate our next community call on July 21 at 2:00 p.m. (EDT) to facilitate a classroom discussion about the roles and responsibility of emergency management in active shooter events. If you have a program, created lesson plans and/or engaged your students in addressing these topics, please drop me an email, so we can ensure we have space for you to share. We will start our call with a few ground rules to ensure that we stay focused on facilitating the academic space for discussing these incidents and not devolve into specific ideology.

As emergency management educators, we prepare the future generations of emergency managers with the knowledge, skills and abilities to create and manage successful frameworks to reduce our community's vulnerability to all hazards and increase our preparedness and resilience. To this end, we need to be prepared to discuss these events in our classrooms.
