Higher Education Updates

January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month. It is a time for us to reflect on what we can do to raise our awareness as well as the awareness of our students. Human trafficking is not something that happens in a distant land to ‘other’ people. It happens right here in the United States. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation have an informative literature review on the topic. While it’s a little dated (2008), it’s an adequate place to start the conversation. It is important that emergency managers are aware of the indicators of human trafficking and know the appropriate steps to report it.

The US Department of Homeland Security has established the Blue Campaign to raise awareness. They have a document library with an abundance of resource material. They offer a 7-min training video for first responders and nine scenario videos that could serve as a classroom resource to generate discussion. Knowing the signs of human trafficking can save lives!
