Brandon University's Applied Disaster and Emergency Studies (ADES) Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) and Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degrees provide students with an applied interdisciplinary understanding, through the natural and social sciences, of the impact and consequences of hazards and disasters upon current emergency management practice. The ADES degree is designed to combine social, physical and management perspectives of hazards and disasters within a liberal arts education framework so students can become new emergency management professionals with a broad scope of practice and wide-ranging knowledge. Applied projects and a co-op option maximize students' experiential learning to fast track them into professional positions. An ADES minor is also available to pair with any Arts or Science Degree. ADES grads are working across Canada and others have pursued graduate and PhD level degrees.
