

British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT) – Emergency Preparedness/Emergency Response Course

Currently the BCIT offers one 3-credit course in Emergency Preparedness/Emergency Response by correspondence. It focuses on the reduction of the effects of disaster through established and proven emergency procedures. The course will cover the time periods prior to, during and immediately following an emergency, as well as the long-range recovery. This course can be taken as part of the Certificate program in Occupational Health and Safety. The Certificate program prepares students to understand the potential safety and health hazards of the work environment, as well as the human relations involved in seeking beneficial solutions and methods of improving the workplace environment.

BCIT is also offering a 4-credit course of Hazardous Materials Management.
