

## **Charles Sturt University - Bachelor of Emergency Management and Master of Emergency Management degrees**

Charles Sturt University in New South Wales, Australia, offers a Bachelor of Emergency Management through distance education. This course is supported by online subject support and forums via the Internet and e-mail facilities for logging assignments, with no requirement to attend on-campus sessions or residential schools. Hard copy materials in the form of printed Readings and CD-Rom based Study guides are also sent to the student. The course offers commencement at the start of the year in February and also mid-year in July of each year and applications have to be made to the university's International admissions office before the end of September and May each year respectively. The course is conducted over two teaching sessions each year, with students studying two subjects per teaching session. There is an opportunity to undertake additional studies in the third teaching session of the year if subjects are made available in that session. Overseas applicants are able to qualify for an eight-subject credit package based on work experience, professional development and other studies so that they can complete the course in around three years part-time study. The standard course is a 21 subject 192 point undergraduate degree that provides a Bachelor of Emergency Management. The university also offers a 2-year, part-time Master of Emergency Management degree. The degree consists of four, two-semester subjects providing a 64-point Master's degree. The subjects focus the student's learning in two areas: emergency management during the first year and risk management in the second year. There is an exit point after 1 year, which provides a Graduate Certificate in Emergency Management. This course also commences in July of each year.
