East Tennessee State University is offering an Emergency/Disaster Response Management Undergraduate Minor. Multiple natural and man-made emergencies and disasters over the past decade have enhanced the need for health professionals and citizen volunteers to be prepared to respond appropriately where and when needed. This minor was created in support of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services plan for combating bioterrorism and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's goals of preparedness, response, and recovery. Students completing the minor will be able to use this training in their careers and/or as volunteers in the community.
