

Edmonds Community College – Emergency Management Certificate

Edmonds Community College offers an Emergency Management Certificate program. This certificate program provides education and training for individuals currently working in the fields of business operations, private sector, security, facilities, emergency management, risk or crisis management and for students desiring to work in private sector business operations, emergency planning, preparedness, program analysis or management for community, voluntary agencies, educational, healthcare institutions or other entities that have a role in disaster response and recovering including local, state, tribal, and federal government.

Credit/Grade Requirements This Certificate is awarded upon completion of a minimum of 44 credits in Core Requirements and Required Electives outlined on the program requirement sheet. A minimum of 30 credits or one-third of the required credits, whichever is less, must be earned at Edmonds Community College. Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all college- level courses.
