

## **Massey University – Master of Emergency Management**

Massey University is offering a Master of Emergency Management. Emergency Management is concerned with both disaster prevention and management. In its broadest sense, emergency management focuses on the organisation of communities to respond to disasters, to survive them, to rebuild social structures and infrastructure, and to sustain and preserve life. There is an increasing expectation that senior emergency managers demonstrate their academic competence through attaining a masters level qualification in emergency management or a related field.

Entry requirements are met the University admission requirements as specified, and have:  
Been awarded or qualified for an undergraduate degree with a minimum grade average of B across 200-300 level major courses and have completed at least two years of relevant industry or professional experience, or equivalent; or  
Been awarded or qualified for the Postgraduate Diploma in Emergency Management having achieved at least a B grade average, or equivalent.
