Nova Southeastern University is offering a Master of Human Services in Child Protection with Emergency Preparedness for Vulnerable Populations Specialty Track. The program with the Emergency Preparedness for Vulnerable Populations Specialty Track will provide competency-based child protective services instruction aimed at closing the gap between ground level on-the-job training and scientifically grounded best-practices. It will develop the critical knowledge, values, and skills necessary for child protection professionals to respond effectively to complex problems confronting children and families in the child protective services system. Students will complete the forty-two credit hour program that includes core courses, specialty track, and research and electives courses.
