

## **Nova Southeastern University, Fort Lauderdale-Davie - Master of Science in Criminal Justice with Emergency Preparedness Leadership Concentration**

Nova Southeastern University's Fischler College of Education and School of Criminal Justice offers an online Master of Science in Criminal Justice with a concentration in Emergency Preparedness Leadership. The program prepares students through the core curriculum and allows for specialty training through various concentrations (twelve concentrations to choose from) to include Emergency Preparedness Leadership. This facilitates choice for students and fosters the development of specialized expertise. Additionally, students may choose among elective courses available at the graduate level throughout NSU. The program requires successful completion of the thirty credit hour program that includes core courses, concentration courses, and an elective. The Master of Science in Criminal Justice with a concentration in Emergency Preparedness Leadership is a fully online program.

The Master of Science in Criminal Justice is a 30-credit hour program. To earn a Master of Science in Criminal Justice with a concentration in Emergency Preparedness Leadership requires 5 core courses (3 credits each/15 credits total) and 4 courses (3 credits each/12 credits total) within the disaster and emergency management concentration, and one three credit elective course.
