

Sul Ross State University – Dual Master’s Degree with Homeland Security and Public Administration

Sul Ross State University offers a Dual Master’s Degree in Homeland Security and Public Administration. Students enrolled in the dual degree program will take all of the required courses for both programs and a series of electives which will be determined through consultation with an advisor. The total course of study will be 54 hours, with 18 hours shared between the two degrees. Upon completion of the course of study, the student will receive an MS in Homeland Security and an MA in Public Administration.
