

Tulane University – Natural Disasters Course

The Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences offers a course entitled Natural Disasters, (EENS-3050). This one semester course covers the geologic and atmospheric aspects of natural disasters, including causes, effects, and methods for reducing vulnerability. Students are required to find information on major natural disasters that occur during the time period of the course, and report on the type of natural disaster, details, effects, death/injury toll, and economic impact of each disaster.
