

## **University of Denver, Josef Korbel School of International Studies – Certificate in Homeland Security**

The ability to prevent acts of international terrorism as well as to cope with them or other mass casualty events if they occur will be at the forefront of many national security agendas for years to come. Given both the enormity and novelty of the task in the 21st century (particularly for the United States), the development of new educational programs has become a vital part of national efforts to protect homeland security.

The innovative program at the Josef Korbel School of International Studies is one of the first and most comprehensive efforts to address this critical need. The homeland security certificate program offers a spectrum of approaches to becoming a specialist in a challenging field.
