

## **University of Kansas, School of Law – Master of Science in Homeland Security: Law and Policy**

The Master of Science in Homeland Security: Law and Policy (MS – HSLP) is a ten-month program designed to provide students with high-level critical and creative thinking through an interdisciplinary approach to security operations and disaster preparedness. The MS – HSLP program prepares learners to engage in crisis management / mitigation operations through the application of domestic and international law. Students are required to apply interdisciplinary course content and legal principles within a simulated homeland security crisis.

MS – HSLP students will engage in courses that address the following:

- International and Domestic Homeland Security Law
- Crisis Communication
- Intergovernmental Relations
- Information Security and Assurance
- Security Management & Audit
- Plant and Environmental Safety
- Epidemiology
- Environmental Security
- Constitutional Limits on Intelligence Gathering
- Constitutional Rights of Prisoners in the War on Terror

The MS – HSLP program is provided by the KU School of Law with a unique interdisciplinary partnership with courses from engineering, environmental studies, journalism, political science, public administration, and public health. The degree is available at the KU Leavenworth location.
