West Texas A&M University offers an Emergency Management Administration Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science program. Through distance learning, fire and emergency service personnel participate in course work that prepares them for managerial positions in the emergency-services community. The Emergency Management Administration BAAS enables students to interact successfully with law enforcement officers, public works professionals, city councils, mayors and county government executives and administrators.

General Requirements:

- Applicant must possess an associate degree.
- The applicant must have the BAAS Block of technical/vocational credits (up to a maximum of 36 hours) transferred to WTAMU on or before March 31 of the application year.
- The applicant must have an overall Grade Point Average of 2.0.
- All applicants should be admitted by the university prior to applying for the EMA program.
