

Western Kentucky University – Floodplain Management Minor

Western Kentucky University established the first Floodplain Management Minor in the U.S. in 2007. Since that time approximately 20 students have graduated with the minor. Fifty-four WKU students have become nationally certified floodplain managers (CFMs). Required courses for the degree include surveying, GIS, capstone floodplain management course, and hydrology.
