Position 1: Candidates must have a Ph.D. in Emergency and Disaster Management (EDM) or closely related discipline with a clear focus on EDM areas, a clearly articulated research agenda, and a commitment to academic excellence and collegiality. The ideal candidate will have a firm foundation to teach a range of EDM courses, both residentially and online. Particularly desirable are specialties and teaching interest in EDM politics and policy, hazard mitigation, resource management, Excs Design & Eval. and legal issues.
