Return to Resident Courses

Effective November 27, 2021 all students and instructors attending resident training at the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) for the National Fire Academy (NFA), or Emergency Management Institute (EMI) are **required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19**.

Fully vaccinated is defined as at least two weeks must have passed since completing the COVID-19 final received vaccination prior to arriving on campus. Fully vaccinated students, instructors, and staff will provide for a much safer learning and working environment for all persons on the NETC campus.

Upon arrival on the NETC campus proof of vaccination is required to be shown once to NETC personnel. Acceptable documentation includes a physical or electronic copy of:

- The record of immunization from a health care provider or pharmacy.
- A COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card (CDC Form MLS-319813_r, published on 9/3/2020).
- Medical records documenting the vaccination.
- Immunization records from a public health or state immunization system.
- Any other official documentation containing
 - Type of vaccine administered
 - Numbers of doses received
 - Date(s) of administration, and
 - Name of the health care professional(s) or clinic site(s) administering the vaccine(s)

No accommodations or exemptions will be accepted to participate in NETC resident training. The campus will no longer accept a negative COVID-19 test result to attend training. NETC will no longer provide testing on campus.

Even if fully vaccinated, students should not initiate travel if experiencing COVID-like symptoms. Ill students will not be permitted to enter the campus. Symptomatic students may reschedule a future class once back to their normal health.

Preparedness:

New Preparedness Branch Course Manager: As of January 1, Ms. Mary Reeves will be the EMI Course Manager for the EMI Tribal Curriculum and the DHS CISA Independent Study Courses. K0051 Exercise Program Management: This course will discuss the differences between managing an exercise program versus individual capability-based exercises, the facilitation of an Integrated Preparedness Planning Workshop (IPPW) and identify elements of the Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP) as it relates to exercise program management.

Applicants to the NIMS ICS Position Specific Train-the-Trainer offerings should attach their credential and deployment records to their on-line application. The #1 evaluation factor for all applicants is operational experience and those documents will assist in the evaluation of your application. Prospective instructors in the NIMS ICS PS program must have 3 to 5 years of credentialed experience, be recent in their prerequisite learning, and have adult education fundamental training/experience to be a viable candidate instructor. 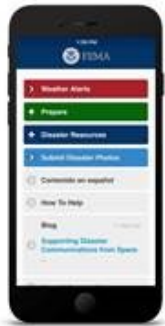
