Learning Management System (LMS) Update #4

Enhancements to the new EMI Learning Management System were identified during the testing period. The implementation of these enhancements is necessary to support the best student experience. The previously shared system outage dates are going to be pushed to later in the summer to allow for these enhancements to the system. Exact dates have not been determined, and plenty of notice will be given once they have been set.

There is still time for you to make sure your records are up to date by following these steps:

- Verify and/or update your FEMA SID details by navigating to "Edit Profile" on the <u>FEMA Student Identification (SID)</u>
 <u>System</u> (https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid). For any questions or guidance, you'll find FAQs and self-help resources readily available.
- 2. Assess your Student Transcript on the <u>EMI Student Portal</u>, (https://training.fema.gov/student/sssp.aspx), exclusive for Independent Study. Before proceeding with this step, ensure your SID information is accurate and current.
- 3. Cross-check your transcript for accuracy and make any necessary corrections before we transition to the new system.

News from the EMI Branches

Preparedness:

NIMS ICS Position-Specific Course Delivery - Challenges/Concerns: Over the last several months, EMI's Preparedness Branch Position-Specific (PS) Section has been challenged with a few problems that delay the issuing of student certificates. These problems are occurring in the pre-delivery, during-delivery, and post-delivery phases of indirect (local) deliveries of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Position-Specific courses ("L" course code).

- Late course applications
- Instructor swaps
- Unscreened students being allowed to attend courses
- Unqualified students (prerequisites not complete) being allowed to attend courses
- Use of incorrect/older versions of classroom forms/practices

- Unauthorized course modifications and truncations
- Post-course packages transmitted directly to the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) Admissions Office
- Post-course packages submitted without reconciling rosters and student online applications

State/Tribal Training Officers and Federal Training Coordinators need to ensure they follow published job aids. Our office has produced the below job aids for your use:

- "L" Course Communications, Delivery, and Completion Job Aid for NIMS ICS PS Courses
- STO-POC—Application Screening and Communication Job Aid
- Student -- Coupon Code and Online Application Process Job Aid

Additionally, we communicate with the Training Officers/Coordinators and designated course points of contact numerous times throughout the process to ensure you are aware of the status of your courses.

Any changes to locations, dates, times, and instructors after the initial course approval must be communicated with the Training Officers/Coordinators and our office immediately.

Mitigation:

Pending Courses for Inactivation and Retirement: Due to discussion with the program office, the National Emergency Training Center (NETC), and EMI staff, it was decided that the E/K8535 National Dam Safety Program Technical Seminar will remain an EMI-hosted event. This seminar will not be retired from the EMI course catalog; the website will be updated soon, and additional information will be forthcoming.

Hazard Mitigation Assistance: The pilot offerings of the E/LO212 HMA: Developing Quality Application Elements course have been completed, and final curriculum revisions are in progress, requiring a momentary pause in approving requests for this course. Please note that course requests cannot be approved until the course updates are finalized and ready for delivery. We highly advise all communities to plan for E/LO212 course deliveries to resume after October 1, 2023. All course requestors will be notified of the status of their request no later than 30 days prior to their requested course dates.

The pilot offerings of E/L0213 Hazard Mitigation Assistance: Application Review and Evaluation and E/L0214 Hazard Mitigation Assistance: Project Implementation and Closeout courses have been rescheduled for September 18-21, 2023. Applications must be submitted for both courses to be considered for enrollment. Registration is open via the NETC Online Admissions system. We highly advise all communities to refrain from submitting course requests for E/L0213/0214 until further notice.

General Mitigation Information: Applications will be processed through the NETC Online Application system. If you need Mitigation courses to support a PTB, registration must be completed in the DTS. Please contact the FEMA Incident Workforce Academy (FIWA)/Workforce Development Division (WDD) training team at: fema-fqs-training@fema.dhs.gov to coordinate. Ask a Course Manager:

Why do applications get "lost" in the NETC Online Admissions System?

Applications don't get "lost." In reality, what happens is that an application "times out" after 14 days if the approving authority does not approve it. There are several reasons how this happens. For example, if a student applies for a course and lists the State Training Officer (STO) as the approving official and:

- The email address is misspelled or incorrect
- The approving official does not know to look for the email from NETC
- The email from NETC goes into the approving official's "junk or spam" folder
- The approving official is on vacation
- The approving official doesn't see or respond to the email.

If any of these situations occur, the application will "time out," and the applicant will not get into the class or will miss the application deadline.
