# Celebrating the Inaugural Graduates of the Planning Practitioner Program (PPP)

In the dynamic landscape of emergency management, the ability to effectively plan and respond to ever-evolving risks and hazards is increasingly difficult. Recognizing this critical need, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Emergency Management Institute (EMI) introduced the Planning Practitioner Program (PPP), a comprehensive training initiative designed to enhance the capabilities of emergency management planning professionals. Today, we are excited to spotlight the very first cohort of graduates from the PPP.

The PPP is structured to address the complexities and challenges of modern operational planning. With a curriculum encompassing two intensive resident courses, E0237 and E0238, followed by an Online Planning Practitioner Capstone (K0243), the Program offers an in-depth exploration of planning theory, project management, risk analysis, and more. These elements are crucial for candidates who aspire to lead as planners and planning program managers within their jurisdictions.

The program demands a high level of dedication and commitment, with a minimum passing score of 75% in final assessments, alongside performance evaluations and research assignments. This rigor ensures that graduates are not just theoretically proficient, but also practically equipped to handle real-world planning challenges. The first course, E0237 Planning Process Theory and Application, encompasses topics like stakeholder engagement and comprehensive risk analysis. E0238 Planning Integration and Contemporary Issues then builds on this foundation, focusing on including planning program management and advocacy for the emergency management planning profession.

The culmination of the PPP is the K0243 Capstone, where candidates have a year to develop and present a comprehensive planning project. This involves creating a project management plan, system map, essay, and a presentation, reviewed by a panel of subject matter experts. This final step is crucial for candidates to receive their

PPP Completion Certificate, representing their readiness to contribute significantly to the field of emergency management planning.

The inaugural graduates of the PPP come from diverse backgrounds, including emergency management staff from various levels of government, public safety officials, and personnel from emergency management disciplines. Their achievement is not just a personal milestone but a significant contribution to the broader field of emergency management. These individuals, equipped with advanced knowledge and practical skills, are now better prepared to tackle the challenges of operational planning in their respective jurisdictions.

Their graduation marks a momentous occasion in FEMA's efforts to enhance the Nation's emergency management capabilities. As these graduates return to their communities, they carry with them advanced skills, innovative strategies, and a network of peers and mentors, all of which are invaluable in fostering a more resilient future. ### **News from the EMI Branches**

#### **Preparedness:**

National Incident Management System (NIMS) Incident Command System (ICS) Position-Specific Course – Certificate Delays: Delays in issuance of certificates to students for NIMS ICS Position-Specific courses can be mitigated. Most often, students do not receive certificates because course packages are incomplete when they arrive at EMI. So, we want to remind State Training Officers (STOs) and other training Points of Contact (POCs) of the process.

All students attending any NIMS ICS Position-Specific course must be screened for selection criteria and prerequisites found in the National Preparedness Course Catalog.

STOs and POCs should use the <u>STO-POC—Application Screening and Communication Job Aid</u> to guide them through this process.

Once screened, students must be provided with the <u>Student-Coupon Code and Online Application Process Job Aid</u>, which will include the invitation/coupon code and the name and contact information for the "Head of Organization." The Job Aid will guide them through the process of applying for a seat in the target class. The "Head of Organization" must endorse the application before it can be processed in the system.

The above process will allow the STOs and POCs to create a "course roster." The roster can be provided to the course host and the instructor team. The instructors can then pre-build seating plans, breakout groups, and the required formal <u>EMI Standard Course Sign-In Roster</u> and pre-populate the <u>EMI Level II Exam Data</u> spreadsheet.

By ensuring ALL students have endorsed applications in the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) application system, the likelihood of the student receiving the course certificate in a timely manner is increased significantly.

On Day 2 of all scheduled courses, the POC and STO receive an email with the list of students who have been endorsed in the application system. The POC and STO should work closely with the host and instructors to ensure that the list is reconciled against the course sign-in sheet <u>before</u> the course concludes to ensure all applications are endorsed in the NETC system.

Note that course completion packages continue to be submitted using outdated or incorrect forms. These forms constitute formal documentation of the course delivery (which are permanent course records) and need to comply with the guidance provided above.

The most current versions of the forms are sent to the STO and POC prior to every delivery. POCs should ensure that the hosts and instructors are using the most current versions. The use of the most current forms expedites the uploading and transfer of data between the STO, EMI, and NETC, and helps ensure that the student receives their certificate in a timely manner.

Additionally, changing of course dates, instructors, or location delays the certification of a course. The POC and STO are sent the approved course details prior to each course. POCs should inform the STO of any changes immediately so course records can be updated before the course concludes and the course package is transmitted per the instructions found in the "L" Course Communications, Delivery, and Completion Job Aid for NIMS ICS PS Courses.

#### **Integrated Emergency Management:**

The Master Exercise Practitioner Program (MEPP) application period is shifting! The application period will now begin on April 1 and close June 1. Applications received outside of this window will not be considered. The process to apply can be found on the MEPP Website.

Opportunities are still open for enrollment in the E0139 – Exercise Design and Development and E0050 – Exercise Control and Simulation courses, scheduled to take place on-campus at EMI. The course dates with remaining availability include April 29–May 2, and July 8–11, 2024. Please note that these two courses are always offered consecutively within the same week. Therefore, be sure to apply for both classes simultaneously.

Additionally, there are available slots for the E0131 – Exercise Evaluation and Improvement Planning Course, which will be conducted in person at EMI from March 4–7, 2024. Please be sure to submit your application for this course as soon as possible.

Floodplain Management: Seats remain available for E0273, Managing Floodplain Development through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), scheduled February 12–15, 2024, March 11–14, 2024, April 22–25, 2024,

and September 9–12, 2024, on the EMI campus. This course provides local, state, tribal, territorial, and Federal officials with the knowledge and skills to administer and enforce floodplain management regulations. The course focuses on the NFIP and concepts of floodplain management, flood maps and studies, ordinance administration, and the relationship between floodplain management and flood insurance.

Applications for the E0273 offerings are processed through the NETC Online Application system.

If you need Mitigation courses to support Position Task Book (PTB) requirements, registration must be completed in the Deployment Tracking System. #### What do the letters mean in the EMI course codes?

E = Instructor-led courses, on campus at EMI

L = Instructor-led courses, at a location other than at EMI

K =Virtual, instructor-led courses usually held within Zoom or Adobe Connect

V = Virtual instructor-led courses held via Video Teleconference (VTC)

IS = Independent Study, offered online

G = State/Local/Tribal Field-delivered courses, conducted by state/local/tribal/territorial emergency management or emergency services agencies
