Advanced Professional Series (APS)

Due to recent inquiries, EMI is providing the following reminder about the Advanced Professional Series. Since January **1**, 2019, the EMI Superintendent no longer signs Advanced Professional Series (APS) certificates. The APS program, which utilizes EMI developed courses, continues to do so, and EMI continues to maintain the courses; however, the responsibility for issuing the APS certificates has been turned over to the state emergency management agencies.

Students have always sent their requests for APS Certificates of Completion to their State Training Officer (STO) or designated State Emergency Management agency representative for confirmation and approval. Since Jan 1, 2019, if a student requesting a certificate has met the requirements, then the State Emergency Management Director and anyone else designated to sign the certificate provide the signature. The STO or State Director's office then mails the certificate to the student.

EMI is inviting current qualified instructors from Authorities Having Jurisdictions (AHJ), for EMI's Position Specific Courses, to assist in the stakeholder review of course drafts. These instructors will not be compensated for their time; however, this will assist in the speed of transitioning qualified instructors to the new curricula. By participating in this effort, these individuals will meet part of the requirements to be qualified in the updated curricula. We ask that jurisdictions provide the name and email of 2-4 current instructors, for each course, to <u>EMI-NIMS-ICStraining@fema.dhs.gov</u> that would like to be part in the review phase of the course revision. please put the Course Number 09XX – Jurisdiction Name (State, Territory, Federal Agency, Tribe), Instructor Course Review (e.g., 0962 – FEMA – Instructor Course Review). List the instructors from your jurisdiction along with their respective email address in the body of your message.

We will maintain a list, by course. The contact information will be used to send your instructors the course material and access to the commenting system. By being involved in the review and commenting phase of the course revisions, current instructors will have a better understanding of the new course delivery and content, will reduce the transition phase, and assist AHJ with getting all their instructors current with the new course(s).

Mission Support:

EMI-developed State Delivered (G) Courses: Several FEMA program offices have contacted EMI about converting existing E or L course versions into new G course versions. While there are no specific details available, as soon as the course titles and release dates become available, we will provide the information.

As a reminder, the updated G-428 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Train-the-Trainer and G-427 CERT Program Manager courses are now available. The CERT Train-the-Trainer allows the states to equip their own trainers to deliver the CERT Basic Course. This effort helps expand access to and delivery of the CERT BASIC course, integral for community readiness efforts and CERT Team building. The CERT Program Manager allows state, local, tribal, and territorial training partners to expand the leadership capacity of their CERT Teams and increase oversight for the their The CERT programs in areas. courses are available on the G-course website (https://training.fema.gov/stcourses/)

Floodplain Management: Seats remain available for E0273 Managing Floodplain Development through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) scheduled September 9-12, 2024, on the EMI campus. This course provides local, state, tribal, territorial, and Federal officials with the knowledge and skills to administer and enforce floodplain management regulations. The course focuses on the NFIP and concepts of floodplain management, flood maps and studies, ordinance administration, and the relationship between floodplain management and flood insurance Applications for the E0273 offerings are processed thru the NETC Online Application system.

The request deadline will be 15 days prior to the class start date and the POC (*email and phone number*) will be the course manager for all Resident "E" courses and the course host for all Non-Resident "L" courses.
