The National Emergency Management Basic Academy is designed for individuals pursuing a career in emergency management and provides a foundational education in emergency management knowledge, skills, and abilities.

The goal of the Basic Academy is to support the careers of emergency managers through a training experience combining knowledge of all fundamental systems, concepts, and practices of contemporary emergency management. The Basic Academy provides adult learners, facilitated by skilled faculty members, a solid foundation upon which to build a career in the emergency management profession.

Target Audience:

The National Emergency Management Basic Academy is designed for emergency management professionals, including members of state, local, tribal, and territorial homeland security, or emergency services programs; nongovernmental organizations, voluntary agencies, or professional organizations; private sector emergency management offices; college or university emergency management staff; and FEMA, Federal partners, military, and emergency managers at other departments or agencies.

Classroom Requirements:

The Basic Academy consists of the following classroom courses. Attendance at each course is required. It is recommended that the E/K/L0101, Foundations of Emergency Management, be taken first but it is not required to do so.

- [E/K/L0102](#), Science of Disaster (24 hours) 3 days
- [E/K/L0103](#), Planning: Emergency Operations (16 hours) 2 days
- [E/K/L0146](#), Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) (16 hours) 2 days
 - (Only an EMI class certificate dated after March 2013 will be accepted for the HSEEP requirement toward graduation).
